It has taken on a specific character (Willard, 2002, p. 13).

The human spirit is an inescapable, fundamental aspect of every human being; and it takes on whichever character it has from the experiences and the choices that we have lived through or made in the past.

A spiritual pathway has to do with the way we most naturally sense God's presence and experience spiritual growth

There is freedom in identifying and embracing your spiritual pathway. It is a little like realizing that if you're an introvert -- You don't have to work as a salesman; you could get a job in a library.
